

AUSTRALIAN MATRICULATION (AUSMAT)

The **AUSTRALIAN MATRICULATION** or AUSMAT is a pre-university program administered by the Curriculum Council of the Government of Western Australia. Students taking the AUSMAT will sit the Tertiary Entrance Examination (TEE) which is the equivalent of the Year 12 curriculum of Western Australia.

Students will gain a Tertiary Entrance Score (TER) which enables them to gain entry into Australian Universities, subject to the specific TER and entry requirements set by each university in Australia.

AUSMAT, like the SAM and New South Wales HSC Programs, is also recognised for entry into universities in New Zealand, USA, Canada, Russia, Germany and into private institutions in Malaysia.

Entry Requirements:

SPM / GCSE 'O' level or equivalent with 5 credits (including English, Mathematics / Science and a pass in Bahasa Melayu). Forecast results are accepted.

Duration:

10 Months (Jan to Oct)

Intake:

January (Main intake), March (accelerated intake)

Examination dates:

November

Fee:

RM 13,000 – RM 15,000

RM 9,000 – RM 21,000

Assessment:

50% - course work, 50% - external examination (Tertiary Entrance Examination).

Subjects:

The AUSMAT program requires students to take 5 subjects as follows:

- **English or English as a Second Language (ESL)**
- **The remaining subjects must include one subject each from List 1 and List 2:**
